TREES ON “SMALL” FARMS

Granite Borders Landcare Committee in partnership with the Northern Tablelands Local Land Services are delivering investment funding to promote planting of native vegetation.

The aim of this project is to improve ecosystem health, increase habitat for native species, provide benefits to production systems and increase land values.

This project will assist ‘small’ (<200Ha) landholders within the Northern Tablelands region to implement revegetation works up to a total of 50% of the total project costs (In kind contributions from participating landholders will be expected i.e. ground preparation, planning, watering and fence building).

*NB Landholders on farms > 200 hectares can apply for funding directly to the NT LLS.

IN SCOPE	OUT OF SCOPE
The following activities are within scope for this project: • Development of revegetation projects with small scale landholders that increase native vegetation on farms • Revegetation using local provenance seed. • Planting shelter belts or wind breaks with native trees or shrubs. • Part Subsidisation of fencing that aims to protect and enhance native vegetation. • Connection of remnant vegetation • Paddock tree protection and clump planting. • Scattered revegetation forming landscape linkages. • Wildlife corridors and riparian buffers. • Improving habitat for threatened species.	The following activities are out of scope for this project: • Projects on farms >200 hectares. • Erosion control works. • Planting of vegetation that is not native. • Plantings that have little to no environmental benefit. • Activities that are landholder’s statutory responsibility. • Landholders who are outside the boundary of the Northern Tablelands LLS.
