

TENTERFIELD FIRES NESTING BOX PROJECT

ABOUT THE NEST BOX PROJECT.

The nest box project will supply two free boxes to eligible landholders in an effort to provide potential homes for hollow dwelling mammals on fire affected properties in the Tenterfield area. The habitat boxes aim to replace the loss of tree hollows from the fires that provided critically important habitat.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE?

Priority will be given to landholders that were directly affected by the fires in 2019 who are , or are adjacent to, an area of high conservation value (ie. Nature reserve, Land for wildlife or neighbour National Parks etc.) in the Tenterfield Shire Council area. Participants must agree that Landcare staff or volunteer can conduct a site visit with them to the area and they must be able to commit to a monitoring program for a minimum of 12 months (under agreement with Granite Borders Landcare Committee).

Landholder monitoring reports due—1st Dec 2020
